The district Renegade Regiment finished their season strong with placements including:

- 2nd Place in Class 1A at Plainfield South Marching Band Invitational
- 1st Place in Class 2A with best Music, Visual, GE, Auxiliary, and Percussion at the Normal Marching Invitational
- 1st Place in Class 2A with best Winds, Percussion, and Colorguard at the Metamora Band Invitational
- 1st Place in Class 2A with best Brass, Woodwinds, Marching, Percussion, and Colorguard at the Marengo Settlers Days

At the district level, we had record numbers of students (20) auditioning and making it into the ILMEA (Illinois Music Educators Association). This includes a rigorous audition on material prepared above and beyond the classroom. Congratulations to our fine arts department.
