SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT REPORTS

Dates, plans and details of the 3.6 academic awards, Prom, Senior Awards, SHS Graduation and SMS 8th grade promotion were announced. Our external school improvement review with *Cognia* has been rescheduled to May, 2022. The *Cognia* committee has been meeting to review goals and documents and planning for the review. Plan are underway to host summer academic/intervention sessions for K-12.

In written reports:

Mr. Sodaro - Sandwich High School

We are in the process of planning a limited summer school program for SHS students. This program, which has been set for June 14-July 1, will meet four hours each day, four days per week (no attendance on Fridays). Students will be selected for summer school based on credits and final grades. Students will be chosen for one of two in-person summer school options. Program 1: Students who fail with a final grade of 50%-60% will come in and work with a teacher to earn back that credit.

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Program 2: Students who fail with a final grade of 40%-50% will come in and work in an Edgenuity classroom to earn back that credit.

Not all students who failed will be able to attend summer school due to limited capacity.

Academic / Extra Curricular Programs & Services Progress:

Prom will take place on May 1. Students will participate in Prom Walk, followed by a dinner at Ashley Farms. The night will end with a movie under the stars at Sandwich High School.

Mr. Heilemeier - Sandwich Middle School

Over the past month the atmosphere of SMS has changed quite a bit. At the beginning of the month, we welcomed back all of our students. Our school is alive and well. Our SMS staff have done a great job preparing for the return of our students. They have spent a great deal of time making sure everyone is welcome and prepared for the final push of this crazy year.

The district Cognia team has started meeting again to work on the district and building level plans. We are finalizing our current cycle and beginning preparations for our Cognia visit next year. Another thing the team is tackling is the implementation of MTSS in the 2021-2022 school year. Currently we are looking at adding a math intervention next year. Work is underway to make adjustments to the schedule for this to occur.

We have been busy preparing for the IAR and ISA tests. We will begin testing the week of April 19th. Our teacher proctors will continue to monitor the direction the assessments are taking.

Academic / Extra Curricular Programs & Services Progress:

The spring sports season is cleared and ready to go for the end of the school year. As with fall and winter sports, things will look a bit different than normal.

- Girls Basketball finished up the week of April 16th. The girls remained committed to practicing daily without games. It was a difficult season, but the coaches did their best to keep the girls involved while at the same time building their basketball skills for future success.
- Track also got started on March 15th. We hosted our first home meet on April 7th with Seneca. Our kids worked hard and performed well for being their 1st meet of the season. They have some big meets coming up here soon at Morris and DeKalb. We did receive word that there will not be a state meet for IESA this year. We are scheduled to have a Sectional meet on May 15th, pending a host.
- Wrestling got things started on April 5th and they have been practicing daily to get ready for their meets coming up. The first wrestling match is scheduled to take place on April 19th. Wrestling will have 5 additional matches after that. Wrestling will not be having a state series this year due to COVID restrictions.

Scheduling for the 2021/22 school year is underway and coming along nicely. Hopefully we will be able to run all seasons next year as close to normal as possible.

Mrs. Ford – Herman E. Dummer School:

Our first Cognia working meeting as a district will be on Wednesday, April 14 to discuss goals and documentation. Our engagement review was moved until sometime next year. We felt with everything going on and getting our students back that trying to fit all that in at the same time would be too much. This actually gives us more time to meet and discuss what needs to be done and move forward.

Although no IAR testing was done last year, reports and progress still needed to be reported to ISBE regarding how Dummer is faring with our state report card designation of Underperforming with our students with disabilities. Our planning team has met and reports have been submitted to ISBE. We are in

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the process of creating/revising next year's school improvement plan and will also be submitting this to ISBE when completed.

Through ESSR funds, Dummer will be hiring a new reading/interventionist teacher for next year. This will definitely help our students with specific needs and will align with our Cognia/School Improvement goals to help students with research-based interventions.

Dummer also continues to utilize student teachers/social work interns when available which has also helped to meet the needs of our students by adding extra help in the building.

Academic / Extra Curricular Programs & Services Progress:

Dummer is in the process of getting our testing ready to begin staring the first week in May. ISBE is requiring remote students to come in to school to test for the IAR test so we will do our best to get them in. It looks like those students will need to come in either 8-9 to finish all the testing. All other students will be taking the tests in their classrooms during the normal school day. Due to 1:1 devices, this proves much easier to do than previous years because of the difficulty we had trying to schedule the labs for all to get in and tested before the testing window closed. We will not have an issue with that now with our Chromebooks. Less teaching time will be wasted and no specials will need to be cancelled or rearranged.

Since coming back five days a week, things have gone extremely well! The students have been very good and are glad to be back as I'm sure the parents and staff are as well. The classrooms are very tight but everyone is adjusting. We do still have to remind the students about social distancing when in lines but they have been listening to the adults well. The weather has been nice so it has been great to see the students outside being able to play with their friends. So far so good. ^(C)

Ms. Greenacre - Lynn G. Haskin

It has been a wonderful transition back to in person learning! The students, staff, and families are enjoying the sense of familiarity and are focused on making the most of the end of the school year. We are working hard on addressing the academic and social/emotional needs of our students.

The transition back brought a few changes to the building. The master schedule had to be adjusted to accommodate an additional lunch period, we added additional custodial time, and classrooms were set up for full classrooms of students.

The Illinois Assessment of Readiness (IAR) testing will be in May for our 3rd graders! This year brings a very unique perspective on the assessments and we are doing all we can to prepare our students.

The "end of the year wrap up and next year planning" has begun! We will be benchmarking and assessing the data in the next month, setting goals for next year, making adjustments where we need to and evaluating the needs of our building. We always strive to utilize our resources and personnel effectively based on what the data shows. The staff is very open-minded and wants to do what is best for students. We look forward to the month ahead!

Mr. Ryan – Prairie View

Prairie View has had yet another successful transition this school year. We are currently in week three of five days a week in-person attendance. The students and staff are thrilled to inch closer to a typical school year. The transition has been smooth, and the staff has hit the ground funning. The additional support staff added for the remainder of the school year has been impactful. We are maximizing personnel resources throughout the day to allow students to receive individualized and small group instruction in areas of need. We are excited to see our students continue to improve during the third trimester.

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During future school improvement days, one area of focus will be to continue to look at data to determine where to best focus our efforts to help our students succeed between now and the end of the school year. Continuously looking at how to best utilize staffing within the building, interventions we find to be most impactful, and investigating any improvement areas is paramount. We plan to continually look at our student population's needs and work collectively to address those needs with all the resouces available within the building. Also taking place during future school improvement dates will be training on best practices for standards-based grading. Prairie View staff will be joining the rest of the K-5 staff members by attending a workshop presented by Margo Sickele. This workshop will help to align further our district's efforts to improve teaching and learning.

Cognia

- Re-evaluate building-level committees and their impact on our learning environment.
 - Our new building-level committees continue to meet to plan for the remainder of this year and next year. The Community Involvement Committee did a great job designing a week's worth of activities to connect grandparents/grandfriends to our school. The One School One Book committee did a great job of adjusting to an unorthodox school year by creating a virtual author study. Our instructional technology committee is working diligently to plan for the use of student chrome devices while in school this year and in future years.
- Create a process to monitor the success of our building-level safety procedures and protocols and make adjustments as needed.
 - Our staff and parent volunteers worked hard to prepare our classrooms to return to fiveday-a-week in-person learning. Once this process was completed, Mr. Ryan and nurse Lauren Hoyt walked room to room to ensure proper spacing of desks, that restrooms were labeled correctly, and that hallway marking are meeting current safety guidelines. Parents/guardians and staff were both provided with updated safety practices in our new educational setting.
- Create a process to monitor the progress/success of student work on remote learning days.
 - Now that we no longer have remote learning days, this goal will not be necessary unless the school or a classroom is closed for a period of time due to an outbreak. However, in our April newsletter, parents/guardians were provided with information regarding how student work completion will be handled if a student is absent/quarantined in our current educational model.
- Create a process to recognize student achievement continuously throughout the school year.
 - Lexia Link celebrations are happening weekly. Individual teachers have created student recognition programs within their classrooms to encourage work completion, Lexia and reflex math usage, and various other educational programs. Students are also acknowledged through our kindness counts program for their acts of kindness.

Mrs. Kern - W.W. Woodbury

Welcome back! We have now returned to in person learning for all of our hybrid students. It is an exciting time for so many! We worked throughout the previous weeks before spring break to prepare for

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the return from arranging classroom spaces, creating floor plans and accommodating all students for lunch in a safe way. While our remote students did not return, we have also made plans for those students to attend on Friday to get some face-to-face bonding and social time with both their peers and their teacher. With the amount of interest, we were able to make this possible. This will be there first time attending school since last year. It will be a very special day! The end of the school year can find us all feeling spring fever and little bit fatigued, but the increase of face to face time has renewed our spirits. We have many school improvement topics, routines and procedures we have started covering again as we look toward a new and hopefully more normal school year ahead. This includes digging into new curriculum, registration, kindergarten orientation, and other planning details to begin a one year. We also have many end of year items still on our list. We will be hosting students for 3rd grade IAR testing, have spring benchmarking, and will be hosting walking club again for students. Mrs. Swan-Gravatt - Student Services

During the past few weeks, I have been preparing to write the district's Consolidated District Plan for FY22. The Consolidated District Plan addresses the planning portion of the grant application process. All districts that intend to submit an application for one of the 12 federal grants included in the Consolidated District Plan must have an approved Consolidated District Plan with ISBE before submitting the grant application. No state grants are included in the Consolidated District Plan. The Consolidated District Plan allows grantees to answer one set of planning questions to meet requirements for 12 federal grants. We make application for 6 of the 12 grants. They are as follows: Title I Part A – Improving Basic Programs, Title I School Improvement 1003(a), Title II Part A-Preparing, Training and Recruiting High-Quality Teachers, Principals, and Classroom Reduction, Title IV Part A-Student Support and Academic Enrichment and both IDEA Part B Flow-Through and IDEA Part B Preschool.

Part of the planning process begins with sending out surveys for both federal grants ESEA (Title Grants) and the IDEA Part B – Consolidated Grants. Surveys were sent to all stakeholders, parents, staff, and administration before spring break. We actually kill two birds with one stone when we send out surveys. Each school year before our Consolidated District Plan and other grants are written, a requirement for all the federal grants is that the district has to conduct a "needs assessment". We accomplish that task by

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sending out the aforementioned surveys each spring. Survey results are now in and now the work begins to analyze the results for purposes of identifying the needs of the district.

Mr. Bloemker – Director of Technology

<u>Technology regular updates</u> – An update from the Technology arena! From August 1st through April 12th, we have closed over 1803 documented issues or an average of 54.6 issues per week. This is an increase of 194 reported issues over last *month*. As of this writing, we have 33 open reported issues to take care of. Of the issues currently open, (23/33) are chromebook issues needing repairs, along with a few application issues and desktop computer issues.

<u>Chromebook Repairs and Support</u> – Chromebook repairs continue to require the majority of my team's time by retrieving ones with issues, returning repaired devices and actually repairing them.

The supplies have been mostly ordered for the "check-in" of the chromebooks at the end of the school year. I still need to place an order for the storage bags, 2-gallon freezer bags. I had them ordered but the company was not able to fill the order and cancelled it. I will get them ordered in the next week or so. All of the other items have been ordered and received.

<u>Registration</u> – The 2021-2022 Registration is in full swing. To date, we have had 835 submissions from parents for approval. This number of submissions is a little behind the average number (917) received at this time. The buildings are doing their best to communicate this process to parents. Based on the current year enrollment of 1837, the current number of registrations completed represent about 45.5% of the district students have been registered for the next school year.

<u>Applications/ISBE Updates</u> – For the standardized testing such as IAR, ISA, ACCESS and KITE (DLM-AA), these are now able to be completed using the chromebooks which each student has. The IAR cache server has been updated with the latest testing information. Some of the buildings plan to begin their testing on April 19th.

<u>ERATE</u>: All form 471's have been filed with USAC/ERATE. We are now waiting for their approval process to be completed.

<u>Other items</u> – We have started making plans for summer projects which includes possible replacement of staff devices and other components within the classroom as well as a re-wire project at the bus garage to connect it to the district fiber optic network.

With most of the students back in the buildings, the district Wi-Fi networks are working as expected and have lots of room for additional devices. We are seeing around 1100 device connect in the early morning then connections go down to around 750-800 throughout the day. Internet usage continues to be monitored for percent utilization. It seems to be averaging around 30-35% capacity. So the district does have enough capacity at this time for the amount of internet usage. We continue to do our best to keep the district fully operational at all times.
